PROMULGATION OF ORDINANCES.

PALESTINE.

ORDER.

(Gazetted April 15th. 1924).

1. The Palestine Jewish Colonisation Association (Edmond de Rothschild Foundation) Ordinance, No. 12 of 1924, is hereby promulgated in the form in which the draft was published in the Gazette of March 15th. 1924, and shall be in force as from the date of publication of this Order.

2. The Law of Evidence Amendment Ordinance, No. 13 of 1924, is hereby promulgated in the form in which the draft was published in the Gazette of January 15th. 1924, subject to the following amendments; and shall be in force as from the date of publication of this Order.

At the end of Section 2, the following paragraph shall be added:—

“And that a parent shall not be competent to give evidence against a child, nor compellable to give evidence against any person jointly accused with the child in the same information; nor a child competent to give evidence against a parent, nor compellable to give evidence against any person jointly accused with the parent in the same information”.

Section 3 shall read:—

“If a husband shall be called to give evidence in defence of his wife or a wife shall be called to give evidence in defence of her husband, or if a parent or child is called to give evidence in defence of the other, the evidence so given, whether in examination-in-chief or obtained by cross-examination on behalf of the Prosecution, may be used in proof of the guilt of the accused person whether husband or wife or parent or child”.

Section 4 shall read:

“In criminal proceedings against a husband or wife for any bodily injury or violence inflicted upon his or her wife or husband or child, and in proceedings in respect of adultery, the wife is competent to give evidence against her husband and the husband against his wife.

In criminal proceedings against a parent or child for any bodily injury or violence inflicted upon his or her child or parent, as the case may be, the parent is competent to give evidence against the child and the child against the parent”.

Section 10 shall read:

“Contradictions in the evidence of witnesses shall not in themselves prevent the Court from finding facts in respect of which the contradictions occur”.

WHEREAS in accordance with the agreement between His Britannic Majesty's Government and the French Government respecting the boundary line between Syria and Palestine from the Mediterranean to El Hamme (which was published as Command Paper 1910 of the year 1923), certain villages hitherto in Syria now come within the area of Palestine, and it is necessary to make provision for the jurisdiction with regard to cases arising in such villages,

NOW, in accordance with the powers vested in me by Articles 39 and 40 of the Palestine Order in Council, 1922, it is hereby ordered as follows:

The following villages which have hitherto been in Syria shall, as from the date of this order, be within the jurisdiction of the respective Magistrates' Courts set out against their names below:

TOWN PLANNING ORDINANCE 1921—ORDER.

PALESTINE.

ORDER.

(Gazetted April 15th. 1924).

In accordance with the provisions of Article 2 of the Town Planning Ordinance 1921, on the application of the Central Town Planning Commission,

I hereby declare Jericho a town planning area.

The boundaries of the Town Planning Area of Jericho have been delimited as follows by the Central Town Planning Commission on the recommendation of the provisional local Town Planning Commission:

(a) From a cairn erected about 500 metres from Ain al Sultan on the East edge of the Eastern road to Wadi Nawaimch in a straight line to the cairn erected about 1000 metres to the East of the Jericho Mosque on the South edge of the Allenby Bridge Road.

(b) From the cairn on the Allenby Bridge Road in a straight line to a cairn erected on the Khaur Abu Dhahy due South of the Jericho Mosque.

(c) From the cairn on the Khaur Abu Dhahy in a straight line to the intersection of the unfinished Army Road and the Old Jericho Road.

(d) From this intersection along the Army Road until the end of the soling.

(e) From the end of the soling in a straight line to the large ruined building near the Kuruntul Monastery.

(f) From the ruined building in a straight line to the cairn on the Nawaimch Road.

The boundaries are indicated in detail on the plan signed by the members of the provisional local Town Planning Commission which is exhibited at the office of the Jericho Local Council, and which may be inspected at any time by any person interested.

AND WHEREAS it was stated that the Proclamation should remain in force for six months,

NOW, it is hereby ordered that the said Proclamation shall cease to be in force as from the 1st of March, 1924.

IMMIGRATION ORDINANCE 1920—REGULATION.

PALESTINE.

Regulation made under Article 11.

(Gazetted April 15th. 1924).

Lists of Persons entering Palestine.

The master of any ship landing 10 or more passengers at any port in Palestine shall furnish the Director of Immigration and Travel, immediately on arrival of the ship, with a return of such persons, stating:

- (a) their names;
- (b) country of origin;
- (c) whether man, woman or child;
- (d) destination;
- (e) particulars of the passport or travelling document;

so far as all these particulars are available from the passport or other travel document which they hold.

NOTICE.

It is hereby notified that all rates, fees, and taxes payable to the Government in Metullah and other parts of the area now transferred to Palestine will be accepted until the 1st of July next in Turkish or Syrian currency (other than Turkish paper money) at such rate of exchange in Egyptian currency as may be notified from time to time by the District Governor.

After that date only legal tender as prescribed by the Public Notice in the Gazette No. 36 of the 1st of February, 1921, will be accepted, that is to say:

Egyptian gold, notes, silver and nickel coins;
the British gold sovereign at the rate of 97. 50 piastres Egyptian.

NOTICE.

Export of gold from Syria.

The attention of the public is again drawn to the fact that the export of gold from Syria and the Lebanon is strictly prohibited and that any person attempting to export gold from those territories is liable under the law of those territories to severe penalties as well as to the confiscation of the contraband gold.

It is recommended that travellers entering Syria and the Lebanon with gold in their possession should declare to the Customs authorities on arrival the actual amount of gold which they carry. The Customs authorities will issue them a certificate accordingly. Travellers who follow this procedure will be permitted to leave with a sum in gold in their possession not exceeding that which they are shown by the certificate to have possessed on entry.

Articles which are prohibited from transmission in insured letters may generally be sent in the Letter mails as Insured Boxes, or by the Insured Parcel Post.

REGISTRATION OF RUSSIAN CLAIMS.

should submit that claim in writing to the Clearing Claims Officer, Serge Building, Jerusalem, not later than May 1st, on the prescribed form of which copies can be obtained on application to the Clearing Claims Officer.

No further registration is required of claims which have already been recorded with the Foreign Claims Office or the Public Trustee in the United Kingdom.

The registration of a claim does not imply any undertaking on the part of His Britannic Majesty's Government or of the Palestine Government to put it forward or any assurance that if put forward it will be satisfied.

The publication of this notice in its present form will be the final and only notification given.

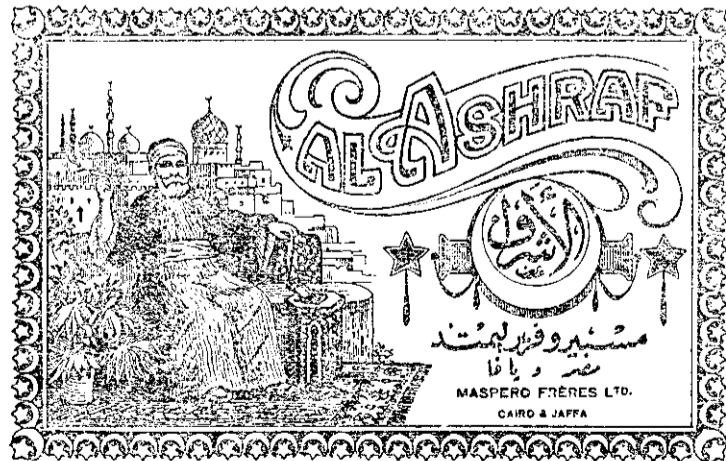

Mr. JUSTICE BAKER IN CHAMBERS.

In re the Companies (Winding-Up)
Ordinance No. 21, 1922, and In re "Hassoreg"
Knitting Works, Limited.

After hearing counsel for "HASSOREG" Knitting Works, Limited, and no opposition to the application being lodged by the Registrar of Companies, I am satisfied that the omission to file with the Registrar of Companies the Statutory Report seven days prior to holding the Statutory Meeting as required by section 39 of the Companies Ordinance was due to inadvertence and

that it is just and equitable to grant relief, therefore, by virtue and in exercise of the powers contained in section 89 of the hereinbefore mentioned Companies (Winding-Up) Ordinance, it is hereby ordered:—
